### January Garden Tasks . . .

- Inspect stored bulbs and discard the bad ones.
- Clean, repair and sharpen garden tools. Wipe them with oil.
- Plan and design gardens for this year. Look at ways to add more winter interest and improve habitat for the birds.
   Consider native plants.
- Try forcing some amaryllis and paperwhite narcissus.
- Order vegetable and flower seeds.
- Start slow germinating seeds, e.g. geranium and begonia.
- Inspect and treat houseplants for white fly, spider mites, and aphids.

### **Garden Show Volunteers**

It's time to get into gear for the 2014 Peterborough Garden Show! Mark you calendars. The dates are Friday, April 11th (5-9 pm), Saturday, April 12th (10am - 6 pm) and Sunday, April 13th (10am - 4 pm) with Thursday, April 10th for set-up.

Each year we have over 100 volunteers for the Show so your time commitment is important to us. A sign-up clipboard will be circulated at the January meeting. Please check your calendar in advance so you can let us know when you will be available to sign up for.

We have a variety of jobs available, some of them newer ones, including Children's Garden, helping with the Horticultural Couture Fashion Show and selling our new Garden Stools. The other jobs needed are set up/ take down, ticket sales, handing out programs/ taking tickets, float, horticultural table and patrol. If you are unable to stand for a 2 hour shift, helping in the coat check area and vendors' lounge are options.

We will try to accommodate choice of days, times and jobs, but appreciate flexibility as Saturday, especially morning, is very popular and our needs extend over Friday evening and Sunday as well. If you could put preferences but indicate if flexible as well it would be helpful. Many members sign up for more than one shift - also very helpful.

We need an early start to scheduling with the February meeting being for fine tuning. I even get e-mails from Snowbirds who will be back by April 11th to volunteer their time. Below is a brief description of jobs for new members or those wishing to try something different.

- Set up/Take down on Thurs starting about 9 am throughout the afternoon, includes getting storage locker items, moving to their places, assembling with cordless drills, decorating, signing out tables etc and Take Down at 4 pm Sunday, disassembly and carrying out to trucks. (Available truck or van helpful but not necessary.)
- Ticket Sales we look for people with experience as some times are demanding
- ♦ Handing out programs and taking tickets as expected
- ♦ Float approaching vendors to offer relief to take a quick break or to direct traffic flow in the lobby areas, answer questions etc this will involve arriving 15 minutes earlier this year
- Horticultural Table promoting the PHS, handing out rack cards, answering questions and interacting with the public, taking occasional new memberships
- Patrol outside at peak hours directing people to appropriate lines or entrances
- Coat Check checking coats and/or parcels for the public as well as Volunteer Centre for monitoring arriving volunteers, handing out aprons and volunteer tags at the beginning and end of shifts
- Vendors' Lounge providing complimentary coffee, tea and cookies for Vendors taking a break in an area separated from the public
- Childrens' Garden supervising activities and helping with crafts in a colourful and varied setting parents must accompany children. Anyone able to help with face painting?
- Horticultural Couture new this year help organize and prepare models with plants, clothing, props and timing of entrance etc
- Garden Stools selling of this new hand-made, local garden product in a booth like setting
