On August 21, 2011 the town of Goderich was struck by the most powerful tornado to hit Ontario in years, causing widespread damage and one death. While much of the damage was to buildings, a huge number of trees were destroyed along the path of the tornado. It has been estimated that nearly 39% of the town's tree canopy, which covered close to 15% of the town, has disappeared. At the District 4 Fall Seminar, a motion was passed to send \$500.00 to help with tree restoration in Goderich. Members also donated \$211.80 to this cause.
