A new TV channel for Gardeners!

I'd like to introduce you and your members to HortusTV, a new service I've just launched in Canada. HortusTV truly is Television for Gardeners.

Like many gardeners, I was frustrated by the complete lack of gardening series on broadcast or cable television, so I came up with the idea for HortusTV. It is a video streaming service, similar to Netflix, which allows



viewers to stream garden videos. Which as anyone who lives in Canada will appreciate on a cold winter's night when the garden is lying under a blanket of snow and it's months until spring!

HortusTV is subscription-based and free of advertising. Currently the library has over 300 episodes of garden shows from around the world; some are vintage series you'll know and love and others have never before been seen in Canada. The HortusTV library will be adding more content all the time to keep up with subscribers' appetites and interests.

There is a 7 day free trial, with absolutely no obligation. After that, if the service appeals to you, you are able to subscribe for \$6.99 per month. Thank you for your time and I hope you will try out HortusTV.
