Marian s love of gardening comes from both sides of the family. She discovered the incredible variety of Dahlias seven years ago when looking for "Jessie G" as a gift for her mother, Jessie Giles. This began the obsession which created Oakridge Dahlias.

Oakridge now grows over 900 dahlias annually, about 500 varieties, on her property south of Peterborough. Marian was trained as a teacher and incorporates her love of learning and teaching in personal education and in helping others get the best from their dahlias.



Time slots are filling up fast, please call, or email, Donna soon to reserve your spot!




Everyone who has volunteered for the show by February 27th will have their name entered into the prize table draw at our February 28th meeting.




This is a book to read...and to learn, of course... loved it.(pp \$20.00)
