Join us in welcoming Anna back to our meeting! Anna presented at the February 2022 PHS General meeting and we are glad to welcome her back to speak about her latest passion:

Gardening During Climate Change – Lowering Your Garden's Carbon Footprint.

This presentation will explore how carbon is stored and how we can reduce our own carbon footprint, including some plant suggestions to cope with a changing climate.



Anna is a self-proclaimed "mad gardener, gardening in a comparatively large garden in Toronto with lots of shade and visiting mink, deer and groundhogs." She comes to us with lots of great qualifications:

as a gardener in local parks, and had part-time jobs in garden centres.






